Does the father or mother of your child:

- ☐ Not listen to the child's needs or feelings?
- ☐ Makes it difficult for the child to ask, or even being allowed, to stay at a friends house (i.e. sleepover, slumber party)?
- ☐ Makes it difficult for the child to express their feelings or ask for something?
- ☐ Behaves in a way that you and the child has to hide homework or grade reports from them?
- ☐ Checks your cellphone, texts, or email without your permission?
- ☐ Check's up on where you are?
- ☐ Tells you what to do?
- ☐ Puts you down?
- ☐ Has an explosive temper & blames you?
- ☐ Isolates you from friends, ex's or family?
- ☐ Controls your child?
- ☐ Acts insecure?
- ☐ Makes false accusations?
- ☐ Orders or demands you or your child around?
- ☐ Acts jealous?
- ☐ Pressures you into having sex?
- ☐ Acts like they own you?
- ☐ Uses anger and threats to get you to act how they want?

A "yes" to even one is a sign of relationship abuse!

Your child is learning this behavior is normal & will be attracted to abusive relationships.
