

Sexual Behaviors in Children:

Guidelines for Parents

Preschool (ages 0-5 years)	
Common	Uncommon*
 Sexual language relating to differences in body parts, bathroom talk, pregnancy, and birth Self-fondling at home and in public Showing and looking at private body parts 	 Discussion of sexual activity Sexual contact experience with other children Masturbation not responsive to redirection or limits Inserting objects in genital openings

School-Age (6-12 years)	
Common	Uncommon*
 Questions about menstruation, pregnancy sexual behavior "Experimenting" with same-age children, including kissing, fondling, exhibitionism, and role-playing Masturbation at home or other private places 	 Discussion of explicit sexual acts Asking adults or peers to participate in explicit sexual acts

Adolescence (13-16 years)	
Common	Uncommon*
 ▶ Questions about decision-making, social relationships, and sexual customs ▶ Masturbation in private ▶ Experimenting between adolescents of the same age, including open-mouth kissing, fondling, and body rubbing 	 Sexual interest in much younger children Aggression in touching others' genitals Asking adults to participate in explicit sexual acts
